

BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT OF CHRISTINE MILLER

Christine Miller is with the Housing Justice Program providing administrative and managing support to the Directing Attorney of the Consumer Rights Project. Christine started with the organization in 2003. She has represented homeowners in hundreds of foreclosure matters. Christine's consumer protection experience also includes fighting predatory lenders and helping clients victimized by consumer scams. In 2015, Christine represented older adults and adults with disabilities in the guardianship arena where she identified and stopped many abusive practices.

From September 2017 through May 2022, Christine served as Director of Community Initiatives and Outreach. During this time, she worked on a wide array of projects including the Vegas Strong Resiliency Center, transitioning the delivery of legal services during the COVID-19 pandemic, and educational outreach events. Christine has testified before the Nevada Guardianship Commission and the Nevada State Legislature. Prior to joining the organization, Christine's legal practice was primarily focused on insurance defense in California.

Christine received her B.A. from U.C. Irvine and her J.D. from Western State University College of Law. She is admitted to the State Bar of California and is specially admitted to the State Bar of Nevada.
