While attending law school, Dewey served as president of the Student Bar Association, member of the Lewis & Clark Board of Trustees, research assistant to the L&C Animal Law Clinic, and the Cornelius Honor Society based on his distinguished academic and leadership contributions to the law community. Through his research with the Animal Law Clinic, Dewey fought to advocate the USDA to provide children with healthier food choices for National School Lunch Programs. In addition, he volunteered through the Street Law program to teach middle school and high school students about their constitutional rights.

Dewey received his Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science, with highest honors, from Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA. Dewey also earned his Masters of Public Administration from the Reubin O'D. Askew School of Public Administration and Policy from The Florida State University in Tallahassee, FL.
