



BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT OF TYLER WINKLER

Tyler J. Winkler joined the Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada as a staff attorney in the Consumer Rights Project in 2018. Tyler advocates for victims of crime at the Vegas Strong Resiliency Center in a wide array of legal matters as well as helping to connect clients with resources and support.

Prior to joining Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada, Tyler was a general staff attorney at Nevada Legal Services, where he represented low-income Nevadans in a broad range of matters including but not limited to: seeking, maintaining, and appealing for unemployment insurance benefits; landlord-tenant and public housing matters; immigration issues; government benefits; and, a host of other civil issues such as bankruptcy, collections, probate, estate issues, legal name and gender identification changes, and criminal record sealing. Tyler is a member of the Nevada State Bar and graduated Cum Laude from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, William S. Boyd School of Law in 2014. While in law school, Tyler represented clients at trial in family law matters through the Family Justice Clinic and defended children at delinquency hearings as a part of the Juvenile justice Clinic. Tyler is a trained mediator through the Clark County mediation program, and helped resolved contentious issues between divorcing spouses at family court as a part of William S. Boyd's mediation clinic. Tyler interned for the ACLU of Nevada and the Bureau of Land Management and took part in a human rights practicum in New Delhi as a partnership between Boyd and Jawaharlal Nehru University, Jindal Global Law School. Tyler's undergraduate studies were done at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and he obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science.
