

## BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT OF GREGORY PAUL

Gregory Paul joined Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada as a children's attorney with the Children's Attorneys Project. As a children's attorney, Gregory represents abused and neglected children who are in the foster care system and advocates on their behalf.

Prior to joining Legal Aid Center, Gregory served low-income individuals in our community as a senior attorney with Nevada Legal Services. In this role, Gregory managed and supervised its Las Vegas Tenant's Rights Center which provides, through several legal advocates, legal advice and assistance to those who are facing eviction from their homes. Gregory also provided legal representation and advice in a number of other areas of law, including: public benefits (Section 8 terminations, public housing terminations, unemployment benefit appeals, and Medicaid appeals); evictions from subsidized housing properties (Section 8, Project Based Section 8, Public Housing, RAD Housing, and Section 42 Housing); and consumer law (collections, claims of exemption, and bankruptcy). Gregory was with Nevada Legal Services for five years prior to joining Legal Aid Center. Prior to joining Nevada Legal Services, Gregory was in private practice for approximately ten years providing legal representation in the areas of probate and trust administration and litigation, estate and tax planning, and business law.

Gregory grew up in Las Vegas and graduated from Ed W. Clark High School. He then attended University of Nevada, Las Vegas where he earned a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in Business Administration – Accounting. Gregory then attended law school in San Francisco at Golden Gate University School of Law where he earned both a Juris Doctorate (J.D.) degree and a Master of the Laws (LL.M.) degree in Taxation.
