## BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Peggy Selesner is a philanthropist and retired casino executive who has been a part of the fabric of the Las Vegas Community for over three decades, along with her husband Gary, who retired as the longest serving President of Ceasars Entertainment.

Board member of Girl Scouts of Southern Nevada for nearly a decade, Peggy chaired the Dessert Before Dinner gala for seven years and was instrumental in raising \$17 million for the local council, which included a donation of a \$9 million camp and retreat property. Peggy served multiple terms as President of the Meadows School Parents Association in the early years of the school, establishing critical policies, community connections, and a collaborative leadership culture between the staff and parent body.

Peggy was the first woman to work in the Casino de Monte Carlo in the Principality of Monaco, and as a fluent French speaker, she spent 11 years as a member of their leadership team. She subsequently returned to the U.S. and established an American office for the Societe des Bains de Mer and the Casino de Monte Carlo. Peggy then became the founder of both World Class Tours and Selesner Associates, Inc., consulting for the casino and travel industry with clients in Turkey, Tasmania, the former Yugoslavia, South Africa, St Maartin, Aruba, Puerto Rico, Nassau, Spain, London, France, and Morocco.

Peggy has been active with Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada as a member of the capital campaign for the new Las Vegas Advocacy and Justice Center. She is honored to have been invited to join the board.

Peggy joined the Board of Directors for Legal Aid Center of Southern Nevada in January 2025.
